- <u>1815</u> After escaping from <u>Elba</u>, <u>Napoleon</u> enters <u>Paris</u> with a regular army of 140,000 and a volunteer force of around 200,000, beginning his "<u>Hundred Days</u>" rule.
- <u>1848</u> <u>Revolutions of 1848 in the German states</u>: <u>King Ludwig I of Bavaria</u> abdicates.
- <u>1852</u> <u>Harriet Beecher Stowe</u>'s <u>Uncle Tom's Cabin</u> is published.
- <u>1854</u> The <u>Republican Party of the United States</u> is organized in <u>Ripon</u>, <u>Wisconsin</u>.

- <u>1942</u> <u>World War II</u>: <u>General Douglas MacArthur</u>, at <u>Terowie</u>, <u>South Australia</u>, makes his famous speech regarding the <u>fall of the Philippines</u>, in which he says: "I came out of <u>Bataan</u> and I shall return".
- <u>1951</u> <u>Fujiyoshida</u>, a <u>city</u> located in <u>Yamanashi Prefecture</u>, Japan, in the center of the Japanese main island of <u>Honshū</u> is founded.
- <u>1952</u> The <u>United States Senate</u> ratifies a <u>peace treaty</u> with Japan.
- <u>1956</u> <u>Tunisia</u> gains independence from <u>France</u>.
- <u>1972</u> <u>The Troubles</u>: A <u>Provisional IRA</u> car bomb kills seven and injures 148 in <u>Belfast</u>, <u>Northern Ireland</u>. It was the first of many car bomb attacks by the group.
- <u>1974</u> Ian Ball attempts, but fails, to kidnap <u>Her Royal Highness Princess Anne</u> and her husband <u>Captain Mark Phillips</u> in <u>The Mall</u>, outside <u>Buckingham Palace</u>, <u>London</u>.
- <u>1985</u> <u>Libby Riddles</u> becomes the first woman to win the 1,135-mile <u>Iditarod</u> <u>Trail Sled Dog Race</u>.
- 1985 Canadian <u>paraplegic</u> athlete and <u>humanitarian Rick Hansen</u> begins his <u>circumnavigation</u> of the globe in a wheelchair in the name of <u>spinal cord</u> injury medical research.
- <u>1987</u> The Food and Drug Administration approves the anti-AIDS drug, AZT.
- <u>1988</u> <u>Eritrean War of Independence</u>: Having defeated the Nadew Command, the <u>Eritrean People's Liberation Front</u> enters the town of <u>Afabet</u>, victoriously concluding the <u>Battle of Afabet</u>.
- <u>1990</u> <u>Ferdinand Marcos</u>'s widow, <u>Imelda Marcos</u>, goes on trial for <u>bribery</u>, <u>embezzlement</u>, and <u>racketeering</u>.
- <u>1993</u> <u>The Troubles</u>: A Provisional IRA bomb <u>kills two children</u> in <u>Warrington</u>, England. It leads to mass protests in both Britain and Ireland.
- <u>1995</u> A <u>sarin gas attack on the Tokyo subway</u> kills 13 and wounds 1,300 persons.
- <u>2000</u> <u>Jamil Abdullah Al-Amin</u>, a former <u>Black Panther</u> once known as <u>H. Rap</u> <u>Brown</u>, is captured after murdering <u>Georgia</u> sheriff's deputy Ricky Kinchen and critically wounding Deputy Aldranon English.
- <u>2003</u> <u>2003 invasion of Iraq</u>: In the early hours of the morning, the <u>United States</u> and three other countries (the UK, Australia and Poland) begin military operations in <u>Iraq</u>.
- <u>2006</u> Over 150 <u>Chadian soldiers</u> are killed in eastern <u>Chad</u> by members of the rebel <u>UFDC</u>. The rebel movement sought to overthrow <u>Chadian president Idriss</u> <u>Deby</u>.
