Source If you've recently been assigned to the Individual Ready Reserves (IRR), your Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance (SGLI) coverage will end 120 days after your assignment date. The IRR is generally composed of former active duty or reserve... military personnel who receive no pay and are not obligated to drill, conduct annual training, or participate in any military activities (except for periodic Muster activities) until ordered by Presidential Authority. The good news is you can get similar coverage through Veterans' Group Life Insurance (VGLI). But you must apply within 1 year and 120 days from the date you were assigned to the IRR. If you apply for VGLI within the first 240 days of your IRR assignment, then you can get VGLI without providing proof of good health even if you have a serious injury or medical condition. BUDGET UNCERTAINTY FORCES MILITARY REDUCTIONS

VFW again calls on Congress to end sequestration

WASHINGTON (February 25, 2014) — The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the U.S. met with Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel yesterday morning to learn firsthand the impact of his department's fiscal year 2015 budget request on future readiness and modernization programs, and on those who serve in uniform and their families.

The VFW and other veteran and military service organization representatives in attendance also learned of the continued implications of congressional budget decisions that could reduce defense spending by almost \$1 trillion over the next decade.

"There are consequences to forcing the Department of Defense to first reduce its budget by \$487 billion over 10 years, then to double that amount due to sequestration," said VFW National Commander William A. Thien, a Vietnam veteran from Georgetown, Ind. "And no matter how some might perceive these lower troop numbers, weapons systems retirements and benefits reductions, the truth is these cuts will continue to grow deeper the longer Congress is unable to end the sequester."

Joined by his top leadership, to include Joint Chiefs Chairman Gen. Martin Dempsey, the defense secretary brought some of those consequences to light when he unveiled major provisions of his department's budget request.

Previously announced reductions to the size of the active Army were increased, as were reductions to the Army National Guard and Reserve, all of which could worsen with a continued sequester.

The budget plan had no new troop reductions for the other services, but the proposed loss of some major weapons systems could further lower Air Force and Navy personnel requirements.

The VFW national commander is especially worried about the proposed reductions to pay and benefits, because "in an all-volunteer force, the troops get a vote," he said, "and a resurging economy will impact individual decisions to join and reenlist."

On the table for FY 2015 is a 1 percent pay raise for everyone below the pay grade of O-7; admirals and general officers would have their pay frozen for one year. Housing allowances would be gradually reduced from 100 percent of costs to 95 percent; payments would be grandfathered for troops in their current assignments. DOD is again recommending a TRICARE for Life enrollment fee, but this time it would be equal to 1 percent of retiree pay — not to exceed \$300 per person — plus additional increases to pharmaceutical copayments, which would impact military dependents as well as retirees. DOD also wants to merge the three TRICARE Prime, Standard and Extra programs into one, and reduce the current \$1.4 billion appropriated support of commissaries to \$400 million, which would force the Defense Commissary Agency to offset the difference either by raising prices, increasing the 5 percent surcharge, or both. DOD estimates that such decisions would lower overall commissary savings from 30 percent to 10 percent, which could close some smaller stores.

"Despite all the challenges of fighting a two-front war over the past 13 years, we know America will continue to field the world's most professional and lethal military," said Thien. "That's why the VFW will redouble our efforts to work with Congress and the administration to preserve the all-volunteer force, end the sequester, and help bring

some financial stability to a military that will continue to operate in a very dangerous and unpredictable world.

"We are, of course, very concerned for our men and women in uniform, and for their families who serve and sacrifice, too, and that is why we are asking the Pentagon to provide more details on their people program changes," he said. "The VFW understands fiscal realities, but we also understand that it first takes people to make our military the world's best."

VA Initiative Shows Early Promise in Reducing Use of Opioids for Chronic Pain

WASHINGTON -- The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has initiated a multi-faceted approach to reduce the use of opioids among America's Veterans using VA health care. The Opioid Safety Initiative (OSI) is a comprehensive effort to improve the quality of life for the hundreds of thousands of Veterans suffering from chronic pain.

Launched in October 2013 in Minneapolis, Minnesota, OSI is already demonstrating success in lowering dependency on this class of drugs. At eight sites of care in Minnesota, OSI practices have decreased high-dose opioid use by more than 50 percent. OSI incorporates the team approach with the goal of reducing opioid use by alleviating a Veterans' pain using non-prescription methods. There is an emphasis on patient education, close patient monitoring with frequent feedback and Complementary and Alternative Medicine practices like acupuncture.

"We have developed and implemented joint pain management guidelines which encourage the use of other medications and therapies in lieu of habit forming opiates," said Secretary of Veterans Affairs Eric K. Shinseki. "Early results give us hope that we can reduce the use of opioids for Veterans suffering with chronic pain and share these best practices across our healthcare networks."

The Opioid Safety Initiative faces the challenge of opioid dependency with an innovative and comprehensive plan that closely monitors VA's dispensing practices system-wide and coordinates pain management to include patient and provider education, testing and tapering programs, and alternative therapies like acupuncture and behavior therapy.

Veterans enrolled in the VA health care system suffer from high rates of chronic pain. Each VA facility employs personnel including Interdisciplinary Pain Medicine Specialty Teams and Consult Services, Facility Pain Committees, Pharmacy staff and Primary Care/PACT, and other professionals to accomplish the goals and objectives of the OSI.

VA has developed patient management initiatives including Pain Coach, which is a pain management app available for download by patients receiving pain management treatments, a Veterans' Health Library, including a Patient/Family Management Toolkit, and resources for Pain Management on My HealtheVet. All of these applications allow Veterans to better manage their pain without the use of opioids. VA's measurement-based pain care includes the "Pain Scale," which reduces uncertainty and helps Veterans by discussing the potential benefits of a medication and possible side-effects.

"The Opioid Safety Initiative is an example of VHA's personalized, proactive and patient-centered approach to health care. We are also using a full-range of support treatments for Veterans, including Complementary and Alternative Medicine," said Dr. Robert Petzel, VA's Under Secretary for Health. "We are delivering health care with the patient's long-term personal health goals at the forefront."

Subj: Legislative Alert #113-36: SUPPORT H.R. 4068 & S. 1999, the SCRA Rights Protection Act of 2014

Take Action!

Issue Background: The purpose of Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (SCRA) is to help reduce the legal and financial burdens that military duty places on our military personnel and their families. It is important for servicemembers to be able to focus on protecting our nation rather than being unduly stressed during deployment by predatory schemes such as scams, abuses and frauds that cause financial difficulties at home. SCRA does not grant the servicemember immunity from civil lawsuits or debts. Rather, the law in its current form postpones actions until the servicemember is in a position to address them.

The legislation has been amended several times since becoming law in 2003 to address the evolving issues surrounding military service covered by SCRA, and now includes matters concerning housing, insurance, and child custody. A 2012 Government Accountability Office (GAO) report, however, identified that there were at least 15,000 instances of financial institutions failing to properly reduce servicemembers' mortgage interest rates and more than 300 illegal foreclosures in violation of SCRA. Many of these wronged servicemembers were unable to enforce their SCRA rights because of "voluntary" SCRA waivers and forced arbitration, which prevents them from utilizing our civil justice system and instead funnels SCRA claims into a one-sided arbitration system rigged by the same bad actors violating the law.

Action Required: Contact your Representatives and Senators and urge them to support and cosponsor H.R. 4068,

introduced by Representative Walter Jones (R-NC-03) and S. 1999, introduced by Senator Lindsey Graham (R-SC) and Senator Jack Reed (D-RI), the SCRA Rights Protection Act of 2014. These bills would eliminate forced arbitration and preserve the rights of servicemembers to bring class actions in disputes covered by SCRA.

Details (To Be Put Into Letter):

The initial purpose of the original Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (SCRA) was noble. The legislation recognized the uncommon burden placed on servicemembers while serving on Active Duty and was intended to protect our nation's heroes from foreclosures, civil lawsuits, and excessive interest rates on unpaid debts, poor credit ratings, and child custody problems while their military service prevented them from addressing these issues. In general, SCRA performed respectably, undergoing many amendments and improvements over the last decade. However, it is becoming increasingly difficult for servicemembers to enforce their SCRA rights due to the expanded use of forced arbitration clauses hidden in the fine print of many contracts. These clauses prevent our brave men and women in uniform from utilizing the civil justice system and instead funnel SCRA claims into an arbitration system set up by those who are originally violating the law. This one-sided system prevents our servicemembers from enforcing the rights guaranteed to them by SCRA.

These bills, H.R. 4068 and S. 1999, would eliminate forced arbitration in disputes covered by SCRA, putting control back in the hands of the servicemembers by giving him or her options of how to defend their rights. It also gives the servicemembers the ability to bring class action against those who violate their rights as defined by SCRA. The SCRA Rights Protection Act of 2014 is a great piece of legislation that seeks to give servicemembers back the rights they were originally granted when it became law in 2003. Passage of this legislation, stand alone or within the Fiscal Year 2015 (FY15) National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), would ensure that all rights of servicemembers are being protected and that the men and women who serve our country give proper focus to their duty of defending our nation without the unnecessary stress associated with dishonest financial schemes and forced arbitration back home.
